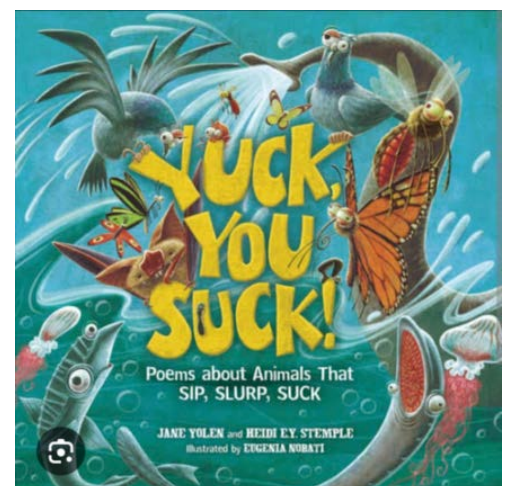
# School Notices
